

Guided Discussion Questions Initial Statewide Evaluation

The reports you have recently downloaded (or plan to download from the sites below) constitute the beginning steps in a process designed to solicit feedback from numerous consumers and stakeholders. As such, these reports should be viewed as drafts. Final reports, which are due on 9/30/11, will incorporate the feedback we receive (see Figure 1: *Steps Leading to Statewide and County Specific Data Reports* on the following page).

We welcome feedback on all aspects of the reports. To better focus feedback, we have provided a brief “guidance” document. The goal of this guidance is to highlight report aspects that need your insights.

We invite feedback anytime between 7/29/11 and 8/31/11. After this period, we will compile all feedback, identify common themes and concerns, and revise the reports accordingly. As will likely be the case, we expect some recommendations from different individuals to be at odds with each other. We will negotiate these differences by incorporating into the report as many recommendations as make sense given the context.

Questions

Deliverable 2A Draft - Proposed standardized template for reporting all priority indicators specified

- Which indicators are not appropriate?
- Which indicators are missing?
- List the data source in which we might find measures that can represent the missing indicator.

Deliverable 2C Draft - Written documentation of the process for compiling the data to produce the reports for all priority indicators

- For which indicators is the computation/calculation not optimal?
- Are there other data sources, data points, or items we should consider for the computation/calculation of any indicator?
- Please provide your ideas on an alternative approach using the same indicator.
- List data source(s) and computation if you recommend an alternative indicator.

Format of feedback

With the exception of general comments and reactions, whether it be to our guidance questions or your suggestions, feedback should reference a specific page or pages in the document so the evaluation team can appropriately address the suggestion or concern. 
