



PEI PLAN APPROVAL SUMMARY

Plan Projects:

This PEI Plan has 9 projects:

- 1) Promotoras for Gridley and Chico Apartments
- 2) African American Cultural Center
- 3) Integrated Primary Care & Mental Health
- 4) Mobile TAY Project
- 5) Gridley Live Spot
- 6) Therapeutic Childcare
- 7) Mental Health Awareness
- 8) GLBTQ Suicide Prevention and Education Program
- 9) Older Adult Suicide Prevention and Early Intervention and Education Program

Plan Strengths:

- Butte County PEI Community Planning was impressive for its cultural and geographical diversity and they actively engaged both clients and family members.
- More than 230 people attend four (4) community meetings and more than 130 people attended the nine targeted focus groups.
- Project #1 will provide PEI services in a culturally and linguistically appropriate way to a uniquely mixed community of Latino and Hmong residents of a large apartment complex. The project will celebrate both cultures and develop a shared sense of community.
- Project #2 utilized an ongoing advisory board of local residents to ensure community needs are being met. This project in Oroville, CA was described by one community member as, "a beacon; an island utopia".
- Project #3 is designed to build collaborative relationships with Federally Qualified Health Clinic's (FQHC) and train primary care staff to identify, screen and refer clients to mental health services.
- Project #4 uses motivational therapy and harm reduction techniques to support young people with the goals they set for themselves. This Project actively supports parents. Peer/Family supporters will visit parents whose children are in the TAY program.

- Project #5 includes an impressive array of services for youth in a small rural town.
- Project #6 provides services to parents and caregivers as well as referral services for families that don't qualify for the therapeutic childcare. Follow-up with families who have children or transitioning into kindergarten is a vital part of the program.
- Project #7 is a collaboration with the Butte County chapter of NAMI as well as Enloe Hospital to meet the goals of this stigma reduction program.
- Project #8 supports the collaboration of service providers, improves linkages with Butte County Behavioral Health suicide prevention services, and coordinates training for agency/community volunteers to reduce isolation of the GLBTQ community.
- Project #9 effectively uses local and state data to drive goals and Mental Health outcomes of the project.
