

PROPOSAL "J" FOR FY 2012/13 MHSOAC EVALUATION

Name of Proposed Evaluation: Evaluation of the Impact of the Community Planning Process through Participatory Research

Brief Description:

The goals of the MHSA rely upon high levels of community involvement and planning. The statute and regulations require ongoing community participation. A community planning process must be in place in each county that aims to continuously engage the community and ensure that all community members and various groups within communities have an opportunity to participate in MHSA efforts and provide feedback regarding MHSA decisions on an ongoing basis. This project aims to evaluate the impact and effectiveness of the community planning process using Participatory Research methods.

The research will evaluate the level of community involvement in planning, implementation, and evaluation of MHSA funded efforts. This process may involve determining how counties are engaging stakeholders, the number of groups held, what factors contribute to maximum participation by target members, and what factors contribute to representation of un/underserved groups and communities. In addition, work would be done to identify how to determine whether or not a community planning process is effective. Finally, the impact of the planning process on outcomes would be assessed.

The end goal will be to highlight factors that lead to desired results (e.g., policy development, quality improvement efforts, accountability). Results of this research could be used to develop criteria for effective community planning that could be used for continuous quality improvement. Counties and communities could use this information to improve their ongoing community planning processes.
