[In no particular order]

- Aging single adults (esp., aging single males)
- Single parents (esp., single custodial dads)
- Older adults (single, on their own)
- Transition age youth (TAY)
- Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and questioning (LGBTQQ) children and their families
- LGBTQQ youth, adults and older adults and (when supported by the individuals) their families
- Intersex children and their families
- Intersex TAY and (when supported by the youth) their families
- Intersex adults and older adults
- Formerly incarcerated (past or recent) TAY and their families
- Formerly incarcerated adults, older adults and their families
- Children and families of currently or formerly incarcerated persons across lifespan
- Refugees – with experiences of displacement, war, state violence, personal and historical trauma (including but not limited to those who have sought or received asylum in the US)
- Immigrants (esp. children and elders and undocumented immigrants) and their families
- People with psychosocial and physical disabilities (including but not limited to developmental, cognitive, sensory, mobility, acquired and organic disabilities)
- Current and former foster youth and (when supported by the youth) their families
- Veterans and (when supported by the individuals) their families
- Survivors of trauma related to interpersonal violence (including but not limited to family violence, incest, intimate partner violence, rape/sexual assault, war, torture, combat, military sexual trauma) across the lifespan, and (when supported by the individuals) their families
- Sweatshop, farm and domestic workers, day laborers and their families
- Current or former workers in underground economies (including but not limited to sex trades, drugs)
- Homeless people and families, and (when supported by homeless individuals) their non-homeless families
- People experiencing multiple/intersecting oppressions (any combination of two or more of the above) across the lifespan
