



Tuolumne County Profile

- Covers 2,221 square miles
 - 2012 Population Estimate: 54,050
 - African American: 2.2 %
 - Asian/Pacific Islander: 1.4%

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Tuolumne County Innovation Program

Tuolumne County is requesting \$153,607.00 dollars for a 40 month Innovative Program titled:

- **Wellness: One Mind, One Body**

Commission staff have reviewed the Innovation Plan and found that it is consistent with the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) requirements. The primary purpose of this Innovation program is to increase the quality of services and client outcomes by modifying an existing mental health practice or approach.

The analysis has determined that Tuolumne County's potential contribution to the field of mental health is to design and evaluate an approach to integrate behavioral and physical health services for the many behavioral health clients who have a serious mental health and/or substance use disorder, and chronic medical conditions in ways that are applicable to a rural community.

- **Wellness: One Mind, One Body (Continued)**

Tuolumne County will mobilize a Care Collaboration Team comprised of clients, physical and behavioral healthcare providers that include managed care plans, and Medical Society representatives to work together to develop and evaluate an integrated service delivery model with the goal of improved mental/physical health outcomes for the “whole person” and the “whole system.”
