Plan Projects:

This PEI Plan has 8 projects:

- 1) Early Intervention Service
- 2) Early Student Support
- 3) Wellness and Recovery Centers
- 4) Older Adult Outreach and Prevention
- 5) Postpartum Depression Screening and Support
- 6) TAY Peer Support
- 7) Community Screening and Treatment
- 8) Prevention Mini-Grants

Lake County Plan Strengths:

- Lake County actively engaged Latino, Native-American, and the LGBTQ communities the planning process.
- The Review Team appreciated that the planning meetings were held in four distinct geographic locations throughout the county and provided transportation and childcare.
- Project 1 provides early intervention services and support to consumers and families who are experiencing the first onset of serious mental illness. Interpretation and translation services will also be available.
- Project 2 provides one-on-one attention to children who may be facing personal and social adjustment issues. This project fosters positive self-esteem, confidence and an enhanced sense of belonging in school.
- Project 3 targets the community in the dispersed geographic areas of Lake County, offering PEI services in settings that are closer to home for consumers and families of all ages.

- Project 4 provides companionship and follow up phone calls to the vulnerable populations of homebound older adults.
- Project 5 supports mothers through the first 3-6 months of newborn care. Funding is being made available to train staff to detect depressive symptoms and make appropriate referrals.
- Project 6 will provide TAY PEI project coordination, peer-training for like-aged volunteers and peer-led support groups.
- Project 7 serves the Latino, Tribal, and Homeless communities who have traditionally been reluctant to engage in County-provided mental health services.
- Project 8 will fund a range of mini-grants that are consumer and family driven. The primary focus will be on reducing stigma and discrimination or suicide prevention with an emphasis on culturally appropriate services.
