Issue:

The MHSOAC Logic Model was adopted by the Commission at the July 2011 meeting. MHSOAC Consulting Psychologist Deborah Lee will provide an overview of the MHSOAC Logic Model's relevant statutes and policies, oversight and accountability focus areas, strategies, actions and outcomes. In January, the Client and Family Leadership Committee (CFLC) Charter activities for 2012 will be reviewed to determine their support of MHSA Outcomes.

Background:

Generally, private and public organizations use logic models for program planning so that leaders and managers can plan with the end results in mind. Logic models are most useful to government organizations when they track performance outcomes; especially, when the measures of mission success are long-term social outcomes, rather than dollars spent. The MHSOAC Logic Model describes the MHSOAC's role in oversight and accountability and how it measures success.
