BACKGROUND:

The Evaluation Committee (Committee) will discuss the findings and recommendations set forth in Deliverable 2E, "Evaluation of Early Intervention Program/Efforts", from the MHSOAC's "Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) Component Evaluation" contract with the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). UCLA researchers investigated three specific "clusters" of early intervention programs funded by the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA). Specifically, the impact of these early intervention clusters on consumers' MHSA-defined mental health outcomes was assessed. The three clusters included: (1) Programs Servicing Children and Youth Displaying Emotional Disturbance as a Result of Trauma, (2) Programs Serving Youth, Transition-age Youth, and Younger Adults with Prodromal Symptoms or Experiencing First Onset of Psychosis, and (3) Programs Serving Older Adults Experiencing Early Onset of Depression or Depressive Symptoms. The Committee will provide recommendations on dissemination and policy implications. This item was originally scheduled on the August 5, 2014 meeting but rescheduled due to time constraints.
