Stanislaus County Innovative Project

Stanislaus County is requesting \$2,377,554 dollars for a three-year Innovative Project titled:

FSP Co-Occurring Disorders Project

- Stanislaus County proposes to test whether an adapted integrated Full Service Partnership (FSP), with focus throughout on substance abuse, as well as mental illness as its “primary lens,” will improve clients outcomes. The project will feature a client-centered, stage-based approach to concurrent treatment of both mental health and Substance Use Disorders (SUD), integrated at every level of client contact.
- In Stanislaus County a significant proportion of people with severe mental illness also have a co-occurring SUD that can substantially interfere with treatment effectiveness and recovery. This integrated approach differs from the more common practice of addressing substance abuse and mental illness separately and sequentially.
